Our Spelling Club members met at St. Joseph Hall this week, competing for recognition as the top speller at IWA.


Seventh grader Shamita K. took 1st place in Preparatory, earning her a spot to advance at the

Families will be sent home with an additional \$25 worth of tickets and each family that sells more than \$125 worth of tickets will be entered in a drawing to win a prize.




Spring Fling 2025
